WHO WERE THE PEOPLE?

James Madison, Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, Alexander Hamilton, George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, and other very wealthy, white men. They waged a genocide against indigenous people, and they were enslavers.

- THEIR VERSION OF DEMOCRACY:

 Who Could Vote? white male property owners over the age of 21 (about 12% of the population)

 The Electoral College: a method to prevent a candidate they didn't like from becoming president

 Three-Fifths Compromise: allowed southern states to count enslaved people as three-fifths of a person for purposes of representation in Congress and the Electoral College, but didn't allow them to vote. This radically super-powered the power of the southern states in the Senate and the Executive Branch.

- Perpetrated genocide against indigenous people
 Owned over 300 enslaved people
 One of the richest men in America when elected

 Had dentures made from the teeth of enslaved people

THOMAS JEFFERSON



- Perpetrated genocide against indigenous people

- Hid a relationship with Sally Hemings, a woman he enslaved
- · Jefferson enslaved his own children, six of whom were born of





- Perpetrated genocide against indigenous people

- Perpetrated genocide against indigenous people
- Owned two enslaved people

KNEE ON THE NECK

A history of racist acts and policies connecting Prince Henry the Navigator of Portugal to the Minneapolis Uprising

1441: Prince Henry the Navigator

Prince Henry the Navigator (1394-1460) of Portugal started the slave trade between Europe and Africa in 1441. This expanded into the Atlantic Triangular Trade, kidnapping over 12 million Africans from their homes and forcing them into enslavement.



1492: Christopher Columbus

October 12, 1492, Christopher
Columbus landed on a Bahamian
island. Motivated by personal greed,
the greed of his royal benefactors in
Spain, and their desire to spread
Christianity, Columbus enslaved the
indigenous people and forced them to
search for gold that did not exist.
Columbus committed genocide
against the Tainos with a combination
of murder, disease and enslavement.





1525-1865: American Slavery

Enslaved people from Africa were forced to work in the United States. Their labor built the economy of the nation and established exploitative labor practices that are still a part of the American economy. The wealth added to the American economy from the labor of enslaved African people is incalculable, but they have been excluded from this wealth and no reparations have been offered by the United States Government.



1788: The United States Constitution

The United States Constitution was ratified June 21, 1788. The Three-Fifths Compromise classified enslaved Africans as three-fifths of a person for purposes of representation in Congress and the Electoral College. This super-empowered the southern states in the House of Representatives and the Electoral College and ensured that slavery would become the norm in the United States. Four of the first five presidents came from Southern States: Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Madison, Monroe were all from the South and all practiced the enslavement of other human beings.



1793: The Fugitive Slave Act

The Fugitive Stave Act guaranteed an enslaver the right to capture a person who had escaped enslavement and return them to slavery. This piece of legislature would become an origin point of police practices in the United States: pursue, capture & punish. This bill passed the House of Representatives in a 48-7 vote and was signed by President George Washington on February 4, 1793. The legacy of pursue, capture, and punish remains central to the practices of police forces across the nation.



1793-1865: Slave Patrols


American states practicing enslavement created vigilante militias to capture enslaved persons who had escaped slavery. These grew into organizations like the KKK, our modern police, and the general practices of our police: pursue, capture and punish.



1793-today: Lynchings

The policing practices created by the Fugitive Slave Act led to mob terrorism that has often resulted in the summary execution of Black Americans. Torture, burning, and hanging have all been practices used by White mobs to terrorize Black Americans.





1861-1865: The Civil War

The American Civil War was fought between the northern states and the southern states over the issue of slavery. The North won, and slavery was made illegal in all states.



December 6, 1865: the 13th Amendment

The 13th Amendment abolished slavery in the United States. Language in the amendment, however, allowed prisoners to be forced into slave labor. "Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction." This would open the door to another century of slavery under the pretense of punishment for crimes committed.



1865-1965: Black Codes

Black Codes were laws passed by southern states to return Black Americans to enslavement. These laws took advantage of the loophole in the 13th Amendment that allowed states to sentence convicted criminals to slavery. Black Codes and the practice of re-enslavement continued until the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1965.



1870-1965: Jim Crow Laws


Jim Crow Lines dominated the South-Louisiana, Miseissippi, Mabana, Georgia and South Carolina were themost repressive. These less were buil on most policies and stripped Black Americans of their right to vote and participate in society. These included literacy tests, polit taxes, properly tests, and voting registration purges. Jim Crow lares were selectively enforced against Black Americans. Omispresent through the Jim Crow era was the throat of lynching.




1793-today: Police Killing of Black People


The Fugitive Slave Act began the policing practices of hunt, capture, and punish; the Fugitive Slave Act of 1850 galvanized them. These practices were integral to the police and vigilante patrols of the South, and have become the standard procedure of American policing nationwide. Thousands of Black Americans have been killed by these practices: men, women and children; teachers, healthcare workers, and military veterans.












OPERATION INFEKTION

An early masterpiece of Active Measures, Oper Infektion was a disinformation campaign run by KGB that claimed that the United States invente HIV/AIDS as a biological weapon.

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PIZZAGATE

"Pizzagate" is a debunked conspiracy theory that went viral during the 2016 United States presidential election cycle.

In March 2016, the email account of John Podesta, Hillary Clintor's campaign manager, was hacked. WikiLeaks published his emails in November 2016. Proponents of the Pizzagate conspiracy theory lastley claimed the emails contained coded messages that connected several high-ranking Democratic Party Officials and U.S. restaurants with an alleged human trafficking and child sex ring. They believed Come Pring Pong pizzeria in Washington, D.C. was the location for this trafficking.

On December 4, 2016, Edgar Maddison Welch, a 28-year-old man from Salisbury, North Carolina, arrived at Comet Ping Pong and fired three shots from an AR-15 style rifle that struck the restaurants walls, a desk, and a door. Welch later fold police that he had planned to "self-investigate" the conspiracy theory.



POLARIZED MEDIA

As media has become increasingly commercialized, the competition for advertising dollars has increased. Instead of focusing on journalistic integrity and quality, commercial media has focused on carving out market identities to attract viewers and subscribers. This has accelerated the divisions between media, and led to micro-cultures and information silos. For example, followers of FOX news are very different from followers of HuffPost. The polarization of media has increased the polarization of people and intensified political rancor.



QANON

QAnon or simply Q, is a disproven and discredited American far-right conspiracy theory alleging that a secret cabal of Satan-worshipping, cannibalistic pedophiles was running a global child sex-trafficking ring and plotted against former U.S. president Donald Trump while he was in office. QAnon is commonly called a cult. Followers of Q were prominent in organizing and executing the insurrection at the United States Capitol on January 6, 2021.


JANUARY 6 INSURRECTION

On January 6, 2021, following then-U.S. President Donald Trump's defeat in the 2020 presidential election, a mob of his supporters attacked the Capito Building in Washington, D.C. They sought to keep Trump in power by preventing a joint session of Congress from counting the electoral college votes to formalize the victory of President-elect. Joe Bilden. According to the House select committee investigating the incident, the attack was the culmination of a 7-part plan by Trump to overturn the election. Five people died either shortly before, during, of collowing the event-one was short by Capitol Police, another died of a drug overdose, and three died of natural causes. Many people were injured, including 138 police officers. Four officers were nor of the service of the stack died by suicide within seven months.

The struggle between "belief-based" and "reality-based" communities and arguments have dominated the social and political discourse since the 2000 election of George W. Bush. People in a belief-based community tend to favor authoritarian leaders and be more nationalistic; people in a reality-based community tend to favor facts, truth and democratic leadership and decision-making. Social media, exploitative media, polarized media and state-driven disinformation campaigns have made for conditions in which far-right militias attempted to nullify the 2020 election and overrun the US Capitol.
